Layne's Legacy - Beading For A Cure is a beading challenge conducted on an annual basis to raise money for the National Colorectal Cancer Research Association.

This project is both a charitable gift and an artistic challenge. The challenge is to see what can be designed using at least one of every bead in a kit - the same kit everyone starts with. The challenge is part of the gift - using your creativity to produce something of beauty that will be different from everyone else's, while all are using exactly the same materials.

All of the projects are offered up for auction on eBay. The money raised from the sale of the items (minus minimal operating costs) is donated in Layne's name to the NCCRA.

We encourage you to reach for your own personal best while creating your project!

BFAC Rules are as follows:

- 1.** You must use at least one of each bead in the kit.
- 2.** You may add **one** bead type of your own (Example: A single additional color seed bead in one size; an additional accent bead type such as a color/size of pearls, glass, stone, or crystal; a cohesive set of art beads). You may **not** add more than a single size or type of bead.
- 3.** You may add findings as needed to complete your project.
- 4.** You may use fibers, pendants, sequins, or other non-bead items to complete your project.
- 5.** You may add forms to bead on or around such as ornaments, pillows, totes, stuffed forms, purses, etc.
- 6.** Only one kit is allowed per participant.
- 7.** You must submit a maximum of 5 high-quality images of your project by e-mail to bfacimages@beadingforacure.org by September 30, 2011.
 - Each image should measure 600 pixels wide and may be whatever height is required to best show your project.
 - At least one image should show a detail of the beadwork.
 - At least one of the images should show the project in its entirety.
 - Your project should be photographed on either a 255 white background or a plain-colored gradient background.
 - Excessive props are discouraged, as they distract from the beadwork.
 - You may have the photographs taken professionally, taken by yourself, or by a friend.
 - If your image files are too large to send by e-mail, you can send using a large image transfer service such as www.transferbigfiles.com

8. If you just need a few more of one of the beads in the kit, you may ask another member of the challenge to send you some, sell you some, or swap with you for what you need.

9. Additional beads from the kit are available from the 2012 kit supplier.
